She was a born teacher and shared her knowledge of gardening, swimming and canning with legions of folks, often with a colorful word and a giggle. If you knew Franny, you got a glimpse of true southern grace and natural beauty. There were no strangers, no one hungry and no one without a full glass when she was in charge. And, if she was with you, she was in charge. She taught us: It is in fact – Good to be a Tennessee Vol, The first of May is a very special day, Christmas Cheer can make pink snow, You can always get a new dog at the dump, Mice don't eat much, There is always a reason to have a party, And most importantly, The Lord God will never give you more than you can handle, He will always pick you up and help you back on track.
